### GUIDANCE COUNSELLOR'S CORNER

#### Teasing vs. Taunting

Teasing is a playful use of humour that brings people together and can lighten a mood. It can be part of healthy friendships. When a person uses humour to hurt or intimidate someone else, though, then it is taunting and can lead to problems. There are times when we all may be overly sensitive and overreact to an innocent comment; however, taunting is deliberately hurtful and an attempt to gain power over someone else. If both people don't find a comment funny, then it may have crossed the line from teasing to taunting.

Tone of voice, body language and the words themselves all affect the message being delivered. "I like your jacket", said sarcastically and with a smirk, means just the opposite. People use lines like, "What? I was just kidding" and "Can't you take a joke?" to try to cover what they are doing, which just increases the hurt. We need to help our kids learn the difference between playful teasing and unkind taunting, and to know which topics should be "off limits" for any kind of teasing. Try discussing different scenarios or acting them out together... and watch yourself to make sure you are modelling appropriate teasing.

## IMPORTANT REQUESTS/INFORMATION

☺ **To reinforce safety for students, ALL parent/guardians are asked when DROPPING OFF STUDENTS IN TIME FOR THE MORNING, LUNCH BELL OR PICKING UP STUDENTS AT DISMISSAL, please do so outside their assigned entrance door. THE MAIN ENTRANCE TO THE SCHOOL IS NOT AN ASSIGNED ENTRANCE DOOR. Your child will know where their entrance door is.**

\*Reminder: **There is no supervision of students before 8:25 a.m.**

☺ **Parents/Guardians of EXCEL students** are reminded to use the assigned EXCEL entrance (not the front doors) to both drop off AND pick up their children.

☺ **Everyone** entering the school is required to sign in at the school office. This includes: ALL late students arriving after the bell; as well as ALL parents/guardians dropping off items (clothing, lunches, snacks, homework, etc.) during the school day, etc.

☺ **Volunteer/Visitor Tags:** If you have one of the Brookhouse School tags at home, please return it to the school office. All volunteers and visitors are required to wear a tag when in the school.

☺ **Lost & Found or Lots of Found!** There are many items in the Lost & Found. Be sure to ask your child(ren) to check if they are missing anything. We plan to have the items on display during Parent Teacher Interviews. Students are reminded to take all their belongings with them at the end of the day – shoes, hats, lunchboxes, etc.

☺ **Student Data Updates:** Please ensure your home, work and cell numbers are up-to-date in case of emergency school closure; or in the event we need to reach you due to the injury or illness of your child.

## NOVA SCOTIA'S ACTION PLAN ON EDUCATION

### New year and new initiatives for students and teachers

As we head into year two of Nova Scotia's Action Plan for Education, there are many more exciting initiatives for students at all grade levels this school year.

This fall, students in grades primary to 3 will benefit from hands-on learning, including using floor robots to learn sequencing and programming. Students in grades 4-6 will benefit from Innovation and Exploration Kits that include Spheros and Makey Makey invention kits. Students in grades 7 to 12 will learn coding through events, such as the Hour of Code and STEAM Olympics, and courses, such as Computer Programming 12. Coding promotes problem solving, teamwork, critical thinking, creativity and innovation. These skills are not only related to learning math, science and the arts, but they are also directly linked to many careers, including computer programming and the marine industries.

With the province's first literacy strategy for students in all grades, there will be a greater focus on the teaching of reading and writing and the development of oral communication skills. Reading Recovery support has been increased for grade 1 students. Students in Grades 4 to 6 will have a renewed curriculum, with more time for literacy and math. Class caps are expanded to grades 4 to 6.

To help more students succeed in math, additional supports will be made available for both teachers and students. Career education outcomes will assist students as they begin thinking about their futures and the many possibilities ahead.
